## Enrollment

A current estimate of enrollment hovers between 77050 new firstyear students. This is still in flux and ZRQ¶WEHRILFLDO XQWLO ODWHULQ WKHWHUP EXTMVeWKHQXP budget estimated 1639 returning studeants, presently this is tracking at approximately 1600. International student numbers are up slightly from last year, but vacillating as people wait for visas and navigate other impediments to arrivathe Chair thanked all faculty and staff for initiatives in reaching out to incoming and returning students over the summer to facilitate recruitment and retention. The Chair thanked Kutay Ulkuer and recruitmenteam forhelping tobring in one of the argest incoming classes Mount Allison has seen in years.

## Residence
